How Do I Register for Trainings?

- 1. <u>Login to your NHCIS account</u> (if you do not have an account, you may register at the login screen)
- 2. Click on the Training Tile
- 3. Click on, "Take a New Training" (this will bring you to the Event Calendar Page)
- 4. To register, use the **Week View** or **Month View** (registration cannot be completed in List View)
- 5. Click on the title of the training you would like to take, and then the blue register button
- 6. If the training is being offered multiple times, click on **Sessions** to select the date or dates you are interested in

TYPES OF Professional Development Opportunities



Early Childhood Focused Collaboratives

Our Focused Collaboratives are monthly trainings from September to June, centered on specific topics. They foster conversations, offer professional development, and provide CCAoNH updates and State info for professionals, administrators, providers and more.



Early Childhood Cohorts

Early Childhood Cohorts bring programs together to work on specific State initiatives.

Participants collaborate, obtain resources, and receive training, technical assistance, and coaching in a supportive setting.



Special Events

Special events are half-day training sessions with one or more presenters, focused on specific topics.



Progressive Training & TA Program

The Progressive Training and Technical Assistance (TA)
Program offers individualized coaching and assistance to child care programs directly.
Programs commit to work with CCAoNH long-term and at their own pace to improve practices related to a State Initiative.



Trainings

Trainings are 1-3 hour professional development sessions held on afternoons, nights and weekends. They cover relevant early childhood topics.



Conferences

Conferences are full-day events with keynote speakers and various trainings on topics aligned with personal professional development needs.

Technical Assistance (T.A.)

This enhanced professional development service offers invaluable support to your program through mentoring and coaching early childhood professionals on a variety of essential topics. With a strength-based approach, our Training and Technical Assistance Specialists focus on improving program quality by targeting State Initiatives. Whether it's via phone, email, virtual platforms, or on-site visits, we are here to provide technical assistance, coaching, and consultation to meet your needs effectively.

Progressive Training and TA Program (PTTAP)

The Progressive Training and Technical Assistance Program (PTTAP) presents child care programs with a unique opportunity for focused and facilitated training and technical assistance. This tailor-made program aims to elevate program quality through individualized support. By committing to a long-term partnership with CCAoNH, programs embark on a journey of improvement, focusing on a State Initiative to enhance their practices and overall quality.

PTTAP Topics

- Business Management Practices: Cultivate quality business management practices through assessment and goal setting for administrators/directors.
- Infant & Toddler Team: Support Infant and Toddler Providers in obtaining their Infant/Toddler Endorsement and incorporating NH Early Learning Standards.
- NH Early Learning Standards: Help programs implement NH Early Learning Standards in daily activities, planning, and communication with families.
- **Program Emergency Preparedness and Response**: Develop Emergency Operations and Continuity of Operations Plans and practice Emergency Response Drills for better preparedness.
- **Staff Qualifications**: Navigate NHCIS Professional Registry, assess staff knowledge and skills, create professional development plans, and apply for credentials and endorsements.
- Strengthening Families, Strengthening Care: Evaluate family engagement practices and incorporate Protective Factors to enhance work with families.

Early Childhood Cohorts

- <u>Strengthening Families</u>, <u>Strengthening Care</u>: Evaluate family engagement practices and incorporate Protective Factors to enhance work with families.






Conferences

Child Care Aware of NH's dedicated Outreach
Specialists are committed to supporting families in their

information about child care options available in New

How Can Outreach Support Providers?

By directing these families to our services, specialists help providers maintain positive relationships with potential clients, even when they cannot accommodate them at that moment.

NH Connections Information System (NHCIS) Profile Updates: While providers are encouraged to manage their NHCIS program profiles directly, our Outreach specialists are available to offer support if needed. We're here to assist you in ensuring that your program's information stays current and readily available for families exploring child care options.

T.E.A.C.H. New Hampshire



T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® New Hampshire (T.E.A.C.H. NH) provides comprehensive scholarships to enable early educators to take coursework leading to credentials and degrees by making it possible for them to afford both the time and expense of going to school.

Recipients enroll in courses at local colleges while working at least 30 hours per week. In exchange for receiving increased compensation, recipients also agree to remain at the sponsoring program for at least six (6) months to one (1) year following the completion of their scholarship contract. The commitment period will vary by the type of scholarship that is awarded.



T.E.A.C.H. NH offers four (4) scholarship options for teachers and family child care providers in New Hampshire.

Registered Apprentice Benefits

- Earn credits from a college or CDA (Child Development Associate) institution as well as a nationally recognized Apprentice

 Certificate
- Earn college credits or a CDA by utilizing available scholarships
- Gain experience through the support of a mentor teacher with on the job training and collaborative goal setting opportunities
- Receive pay increases upon program completion
- Offers an opportunity to earn credit for previous early childhood work experience
- Participants are eligible to receive 9 college credits for CDA at participating colleges

The Southern NH Services and Department of Labor Early Childhood Apprenticeship Program (ECAP) is a training opportunity for individuals employed in the early childhood field.

It is designed to combine classroom instruction and work experience to enhance the quality of care for children while increasing the apprentice's skill level and wages.

The goal of ECAP is for individuals to obtain the credential required to work as a teacher in a state licensed childcare center, increasing the supply of skilled professionals and the delivery of high quality early education. Click on the ECAP Program Flyer to learn more about the Program.

Mentor Benefits:

- Training focused on mentoring others in an early childhood education classroom
- A stipend for your work of mentoring each apprentice
- An opportunity to share and deepen your knowledge and excitement for the field
- Work with the Apprenticeship Program Coordinator on topics such as:
 - Reflective supervision
 - Creating supportive evaluations
 - Mentorina techniaues
- Opportunity to develop and demonstrate your skills as leader, adult educator and administrator
